FALL 2010 SELF-SCHEDULING

Self-Scheduling will take place in the gym on Wednesday, June 2, 2010. Students are to report to the auditorium first to pick up their green/blue/yellow Arena Sheet at the alpha rotation time indicated below:

TIME ADJUSTMENT FOR ARENA!!

The time at which your RAP begins for the arena, as announced in the past bulletins, is actually the time at which you enter the gymnasium. However, **you need to assemble at the flagpole 30 minutes earlier** than that, because there is a half-hour process of lining up at the sticks, entering the auditorium, Dean Cordoba makes announcements, green sheets are handed out, and you leave the auditorium in a calm and orderly fashion. Below you will find two schedules of times. The first is the time at which you need to be at the flagpole, the second is the time (already described in the bulletins) when your RAP will be entering the gym.
